SEEKING SAFETY IS NOT A CRIME. SAVING LIVES IS NOT A CRIME.

So far this year more than 800 people have died attempting to cross the central Mediterranean.

The UK Government has exacerbated this appalling situation, having supported the Libyan coastguard through training and funding, enabling the return of refugees and migrants to detention centres where thousands of people including children were kept in inhumane conditions.

"The UK Government has a responsibility to refugees and migrants who have suffered due to its actions and inaction in Libya," said Vickie Hawkins, executive director of MSF UK.

"They were well aware of the detention conditions to which refugees and migrants were being returned through their own humanitarian support to those detention centres, and so we are calling on them to now provide safe and legal routes directly to the UK.

"They should also contribute to state-led search and rescue in the Mediterranean, and publicly support NGO search and rescue efforts at this critical moment to ensure that no one dies trying to flee to safety."

We're deeply concerned about proposals in the government's New Plan for Immigration outlining a system in which refugees would be punished for irregular arrivals even as the government steadily closes legal routes.

The Dubs Scheme was shut last year and the government rejected attempts to secure a replacement, and a proposed global resettlement scheme has still not appeared and no date for its launch has been provided.

"People in dangerous situations like Libya have no choice over how they get to safety. They should not be left to drown or to be locked up in detention centres as a punishment for taking the sea crossing or to deter others from making similar journeys. It is not too late for the government to change course away from this mindlessly punitive approach," says Hawkins.

GLOBAL TENSIONS CONTINUE TO RISE

While the eyes of the world have largely been on the Covid-19 crisis in recent months, tensions around the world relating to nuclear weapons and states that are pursuing their own arsenals have continued to rise. The situation on the Korean Peninsula remains tense, with little sign of any diplomatic progress between the United States and Pyongyang. Rhetoric has been increasingly heated since Joe Biden took over in the Oval Office and has not been helped by the restrictions on the missile capability of South Korea being eased in May. The North Korean regime said this created a 'delicate' situation on the Peninsula. We continue to be in touch with the Bargn Nuri Christian Community in South Korea and were delighted they could join us at our recent 24-Hour Prayer Vigil. Please do keep them in your prayers as they work for peace. There has been some signs of progress in the other potential flashpoint – with parties involved with the Iran Nuclear Deal continuing to meet in Geneva for talks aimed at reviving the deal. The United States is not involved after directly Donald Trump unilaterally violated the Treaty in 2018, but has been taking part through intermediaries. The hope is that there will be a breakthrough which would see sanctions on Iran lifted in return for increased inspections and limitations on the level of uranium Tehran is able to enrich. Another part of the world to keep in our prayers over the coming months.

GOVERNMENT UNVEILS PLANS FOR MORE NUCLEAR WEAPONS

The big announcement trailed ahead of the publication of the Integrated Review was the huge increase in military spending, even while cutting billions in aid to the world's poorest. So it came as something of a shock when reports emerged that Boris Johnson wanted to increase the UK nuclear warhead stockpile by 44% by the middle of the 2020s.

Since the end of the Cold War, when the UK stockpile peaked at around 500 warheads, successive governments have had a policy of gradual reduction. The Security Review of 2010 set a cap on the number of warheads the UK would hold at 180, a commitment reaffirmed in 2015. The increase of that cap to 260 comes despite no request from the military and not one MP raising the size of the stockpile in Parliament.

Condemnation of the announcement was swift. The UN Secretary General said, through his spokesperson, that the increase would be a breach of international law, as Britain has signed the Nuclear Non-proliferation Treaty. The German Foreign Minister also distanced himself from the move saying Germany "wants to see nuclear stockpiles decrease".

Christians have also joined the criticism of the announcements. A statement issued by the Joint Public Issues Team and signed by seven denominational representatives described the decision as a "retrograde step that will not make any of us safer." The Archbishop of Canterbury Justin Welby, speaking in the House of Lords, called the increase "very serious and concerning".

Also included in the Integrated Review were steps to increase secrecy around the UK nuclear weapons programme government will no longer tell us how many warheads it has or how many are operational. There is also a potentially deeply worrying change in when nuclear weapons could be used by the UK. Previously governments have stated that nuclear weapons would only be used in retaliation for a nuclear strike against the UK — but now it's possible they could be used in response to a non-nuclear attack and even against a cyber attack. The Archbishop of Canterbury said that the increased ambiguity around the circumstances when a nuclear weapon might be used "increases the risk of disastrous miscalculation"

NUCLEAR FUSION NOT THE ANSWER

CND Vice-President and expert consultant on radioactivity in the environment Dr Ian Fairlie explains why the latest nuclear idea from the government cannot be supported.

Nuclear fusion would be far from cheap, clean, safe or healthy.

THE GOVERNMENT'S new panacea for our energy needs - nuclear fusion - has almost nothing to do with our needs and everything to do with Prime Minister Boris Johnson's ill considered techno-dreams. It will most likely join the line of Boris' flops after the Thames Gateway airport, the Emirates air-line cable car, the Thames Garden bridge etc. But this time the taxpayer will have to pay billions rather than millions. What is nuclear fusion? It's a dangerous process whereby radioactive hydrogen (tritium) is smashed into another form of hydrogen (deuterium) at massive temperatures and pressures inside a plasma to release much radiation and some heat. The same process occurs in our Sun, but safely located 93 million miles away. Formidable technical problems exist. Since it commenced in 1983, the UK's JET fusion torus at Culham in Oxfordshire has not produced a single watt of usable electricity.

Many critics have stated that JET's success is always 30 years in the future: it is the same today as it was 30 years ago. In October 2019, the UK government announced funding for a smaller fusion reactor called STEP (Spherical Tokamak for Energy Production) based on the unsuccessful JET prototype at Culham.

Quite why the STEP project is expected to work when its prototype has failed is unexplained in official documents. In December 2020, the government asked local authorities to come forward with potential sites Many LAs are so strapped for cash and close to bankruptcy that several have responded, regardless of the myriad problems. The plan is for the government to choose a site by 2024.

The government promises fusion will deliver cheap and clean energy to help move to a zero -carbon economy with little radioactive waste. But these claims are simply untrue – like many government statements in recent years. The reality is that fusion reactors, if ever operated. would produce many radioactive by-products that are far from harmless. Most (around 80%) of the energy would be high-energy neutrons causing structural damage, much radioactive waste and the need for biological shielding to protect operators and the public nearby. In short, nuclear fusion would be far from cheap, clean, safe or healthy. Dr Daniel Jassby is a former research physicist at the Princeton Plasma Physics Lab, US and has worked for 25 years on neutron production from fusion. He says: "When you consider we get solar and wind energy for free, to rely on fusion reaction would be foolish". Quite.

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RED POPPIES

Royal British Legion will no longer sell poppies in the European Union due to red tape following Brexit, according to reports.

The charity, which provides support to members and veterans of the British Armed Forces, is said to have sent an email to supporters stating it will "need to cease sales to customers in countries in the EU" for the foreseeable future until legislation surrounding Brexit is reviewed.

The i-newspaper reported that it could not justify the expense, including customs charges, to send poppies overseas following Britain's departure from the EU's customs union.

RIGHTS BODY FINDS ISRAEL GUILTY OF APARTHEID

In a report published on 26th April, the New York-based Human Rights Watch accuses Israeli officials of the crimes of apartheid and persecution, claiming that the government enforces a policy of "maintaining the domination by Jewish Israelis over Palestinians". It claims that after decades of warnings that the Israeli government's hold over Palestinian life could lead to apartheid, it found that the "threshold" had been crossed. The report compares policies and practices towards the nearly seven million Palestinians in the occupied territories and Israel with those towards a similar number of Jewish Israelis there.

Apartheid is a crime against humanity under international law. It is defined under the 1998 Rome Statute as an "institutionalised regime of systematic oppression and domination by one racial group over any other" with the intent of "maintaining that regime".
