UKRAINE - WHAT'S BEHIND THE CONFLICT?

WEDNESDAY 2nd MARCH at 7.30pm Speaker: Lindsey German

Lindsey German is a socialist writer and campaigner. She is convenor of the Stop the War Coalition which she helped establish in 2001 following the events of 9/11. The organisation built the largest demo in British history on February 15th 2003 against the Iraq war. It has thousands of members, groups around the UK, and many trade union and other affiliates. It continues to campaign against British government policies on war, militarism, civil liberties and against Islamophobia.

Lyndsey says "I will cover very briefly why there is conflict, then go on to looking at Nato expansion and the nature of Nato, the role of US imperialism (I also think Russia has imperialist role but think as campaigners in Britain we have to concentrate our main effort on our own government and its allies). I would also look at the British government and the main opposition, which as Keir Starmer has made clear this week is completely committed to a belligerent agenda."

ENOUGH
CONTRADICTION
DISARM OXFORD NOW

On 4 November, students and residents of Oxford found city and University buildings dotted with posters criticising the University's alleged "complicity with the arms trade." The posters were placed by the relatively new group Disarm Oxford, which seeks to "[lobby] the University departments and colleges - to sever ties with arms companies, to stop taking research funding from such companies and to cease Careers Service advertising for them". One such poster features the image of Wafic Saïd, the namesake of Oxford's Saïd Business School, referring to him as a "world famous arms dealer." Saïd, one of Britain's wealthiest men, fixed the Saudi purchase of British arms in 1985, known as the Al-Yamamah deal, considered one of the largest-ever arms deals in history. "Having a business school after someone called an arms dealer honours an industry we think deserves nothing but dishonour," said Matt Rosen, a student activist with Disarm Oxford.

They are not only criticising the names of buildings. Another poster read, "Oxford doesn't invest in tobacco because it puts lives at risk. But it's happy to work with the arms trade. Enough contradiction. Disarm Oxford now."

STOP HIJACKING AID

The government will soon publish a new aid strategy that looks set to prioritise trade and investment over poverty reduction

Next month the foreign secretary Liz Truss is set to publish a new International Development Strategy which will set the direction of UK aid spending for years to come.

For too long, we have seen this government redirecting aid away from the world's most marginalised communities and into the pockets of the private sector.

In December, the foreign secretary gave an indication that the new strategy will focus on trade, investment and "economic partnerships". Not one mention of climate change, global public health or food security.

Global Justice campaigns for a development budget that supports the needs of the many, rather creating more opportunities for the wealthiest few. As the government prepares to go further in the wrong direction, it's vital we keep standing up for what's right.

The corporate hijack of aid

Global Justice has reported regularly on the many ways in which aid has been used in recent years to divert funds to the private sector and support the needs of British businesses over the world's most marginalised communities. This includes:

- Billions given to the UK development bank CDC Group to invest in private businesses and equity funds
- Support for unaffordable, for-profit schools and hospitals that exclude lower income groups
- Money spent in countries and sectors which UK businesses hope to profit from
- Hundreds of millions spent in consultancy and research fees with big accountancy firms

An example? The UK was diverting aid to Malaysia to construct a hugely costly dam on the condition that the Malaysian military would buy arms from UK companies. After numerous protests and a court case, the funding was deemed unlawful.

We need to keep fighting and raising our voices to oppose this misuse of aid together. Rather than tackling these issues with the existing use of aid, this new strategy seems set to make them worse. Go to the

US B-52 BOMBERS ARRIVE IN BRITAIN FOR EXERCISES

The US Air Force announced Thursday a set of B-52 strategic bombers had landed in Britain for scheduled NATO exercises, amid heightened tensions between the bloc and Russia over Ukraine.

The North Dakota-based aircraft, support equipment, and personnel touched down at a Royal Air Force base 150 kilometers (90 miles) west of London, in Fairford, England, the command of US Air Forces in Europe said in a statement.



It did not specify how many US aircraft would be participating in the exercises.

The statement explained that the "long-planned" Bomber Task Force mission aims to improve "cooperation and operational capacity, capability and interoperability" among allies.

"Bomber rotations reinforce the US commitment to NATO allies and coalition partners to maintain our collective safety and sovereignty," it added.

The deployment comes amid fears that Russia is planning to invade its pro-Western neighbour Ukraine, with ten of thousands of Russian troops mobilized along the border.

The US Navy meanwhile said on Thursday that four of its destroyers had deployed last month to take part in exercises in the zone covered by the Sixth Fleet, which includes the Mediterranean.

Russia also said on Thursday that four of its warships had arrived off the Crimean peninsula for upcoming exercises in the Black Sea, off the southern coast of Ukraine.

NO TO WAR IN UKRAINE Stop the War statement

The danger of conflict between major powers is greater now than for many years. The Russian invasion in Ukraine cannot be justified and the troops must withdraw. There must be an immediate ceasefire. We send our solidarity to the Ukrainian people and the brave demonstrators in Russia campaigning for peace.

The danger of war is already there for the Ukrainian people but there is also a fear that it can escalate still further. The urgent need now is to end this war. Instead Boris Johnson's government continues to send military hardware to the region and there is talk of further intervention.

All the more reason then to maintain a strong anti-war voice. Stop the War has been on the receiving end of many attacks in recent days and weeks, including from the leaders of both major parties, accused of being the 'enemy within'. We have always opposed war over Ukraine, but we have also criticised our government and its allies, especially the role of Nato. We stand by those positions and we know that many of you do as well.

We need your support now. There is a strong anti-war sentiment among British people - in the last week alone over 10,000 people have <u>signed our statement</u> and thousands have signed up to our newsletter. But we need this support to be translated into action so that we can step up our campaigning in this dangerous situation.

PALESTINE ACTION TO DISRUPT ISRAELI WEAPONS FACTORIES

It is easy to think that in spite of all our efforts in our work for peace, we don't get many successes. That's why we must recognise our achievements - and I think this one definitely



counts as a success that we can all share in because we did play a small part in it.

We supported the 'Elbit Out of Oldham' campaign (part of 'Palestine Action') by inviting Jacqui Greenfield to speak to us in July last year. Those who watched her presentation will remember a very lively and enthusiastic presentation – and their campaign <u>has</u> succeeded! Elbit <u>IS</u> out of Oldham. The factory is closing down, and all those involved in any way at all are celebrating. So we can celebrate too.

Factories in Runcorn and Reading supply Israeli-owned Elbit Systems in Britain with components for pilotless aircraft for the Israeli military. Elbit promotes its drones as 'battle-tested' meaning they have been used in attacks on Palestinians. The Oldham site is closing – so there are nine more British sites to go!! Perhaps we should invite Jacqui back again to tell us how they are going to continue their campaigning, but meanwhile we can share in their success!


