6) REPORTS AND DISCUSSION

a) FPG Meetings – Jennie

Jennie has had a well-deserved little rest from organising meetings this year, though monthly meetings carried on till lockdown in March and have now resumed via zoom:

Nov - Jennifer Gibson from **'Reprieve'** - a human rights group; Dec - Calvin Tucker **'Latin America: the Left fights back'**; Feb - Sjoerd Vogt **'False Flag Operations'**; Mar - Phil Chesterton **'Whatever Happened to the Chagos Islanders?'**

Thereafter we were overtaken by covid-19 and therefore have missed out on hearing about: **'Vision 2020- and the decision of the United States to dominate Space'** and **'First use' of Nuclear Weapons'** – a talk by a retired Polaris submarine Commander, which Jennie hopes to rearrange, possibly for November.

The talk on **'The Impact of the UK's Nuclear Test Programme on Fiji and the Christmas Islands'** with ex-Faringdon resident John Cooper will not take place as, due to Covid restrictions, John could not travel to Fiji as planned.

20 people enjoyed the New Year's social at Karen and Sjoerd's in January.

Other Activities and Events – Jennie Oxfordshire Peace Campaign (OPC)

We were represented at meetings by Jennie, Phil and Helen. Thanks are due, once again to Nigel Day and Chris Brennan for the spadework behind the meetings and organisation of the annual Rally at (USAF) Croughton. On 5th October 2019, the speakers were Paul Mobbs (our guru on all things Croughton), Dave Cullen from the Nuclear Information Service (we have had several talks from the NIS at the Peace Group) and Fabian Hamilton, a Labour MP who was Minister for Peace and Disarmament in Jeremy Corbyn's shadow cabinet. It was at this Rally that we first heard about the young Harry Dunn, killed 3 weeks previously in a road accident outside the base, by the wife of an intelligence officer. The court case regarding the extradition of Anne Sacoolas continues.

This year, 2020, CND organised a zoomed Rally on behalf of OPC and those who couldn't join will be able to watch it on the CND website shortly.

Shared Humanity

We were asked by Howard Grace (who had spoken at one of our monthly meetings) to host a meeting with Letlapa Mphahlele, which we were very pleased to do, as we had only previously seen Letlapa on film. From being a soldier fighting during the long struggle against apartheid in South Africa, he had changed to talking to groups, especially school students, about the power of forgiveness, and our 'shared humanity'.

Remembrance Day Sunday 10 November

The British legion again allowed us to lay a wreath on the War Memorial in memory of ALL those who have died in wars. Thanks to Karen for performing this task.

Armistice Day Monday 11 November

In the Market Square, we held a Women in Black Silent Vigil for Peace and 5 women on the vigil were supported by 3 men giving out leaflets explaining why we were there.

Extinction Rebellion

Thanks to Karen and Helen who took part in various events, resulting in a court case for Helen, (which was eventually thrown out).

General Election Hustings 25 November

Following what has become customary for Faringdon Peace Group, we organised hustings in the Corn Exchange, for a gratifyingly large audience.

Vigil for Peace in Bethlehem

We held our usual Women in Black vigil for Bethlehem in the Market Place in December.

b) Faringdon Folly and posters round town – Karen

Karen's monthly meeting reports were all published in the 'Folly' newspaper until it sadly closed along with the What's On – the diary of local events started by the Braithwaites. Lou is expanding the Faringdon Advertiser to take more reports and events etc. so we will take advantage of that now meetings (virtual) have resumed.

c) Treasurer – Steve

Steve presented the Income and Expenditure account for the year ending 31st August 2020, which obviously showed a significant drop with a balance of £2677 (2019 - £3859) due to zero income from the Grand Peace Fete, which took place online this year.

We have not had to pay rent or speakers' expenses since lockdown, but with £2000 ring-fenced for the Peace Plaque, potential XR expenses and 40th Anniversary celebrations, we are not in a position to donate to worthy causes.

Subscriptions to Network for Peace will continue for our monthly copies of Peace News, which Jennie has continued to distribute, and to CND, partly because FPG insurance is arranged through them.

Thanks to Steve for doing the finances and to John Cecil for auditing the accounts.

Sjoerd thanked Zoe and Trev Williams for putting on such an imaginative, varied and interactive fete this year. They did a great job!
